

RESEARCH QUESTION

How geothermal energy politize subsurface in energy transition context?

1970's energy crisis: geothermal energy has been developing in Paris Basin (district heating) → successful, first renewable energy in Paris Region

2013-2019: energy transition: renewable electricity → lot of failure, a lack of social acceptability or something else?




Industrial expectations	Academic expectations
<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Bringing together a wide range of stakeholders (SHS, STEM, industry, administration, etc.)- To have a methodology for getting projects "accepted" and "getting people involved". <p>⇒ Operational response</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Produce an understanding of the world using the scientific method, make knowledge- Doctoral student: acquiring a scientific approach and validating a diploma <p>⇒ Conceptual response</p>

- **Asserting your position as a researcher:** we're not here to do social engineering
- **Deconstruct** industrialists' preconceptions (social acceptability)
- Take a **reflective stance on the relationship of the social sciences and society**, particularly in the current context.








Pau: Use a monowell




Political Geology

- Geological problems are politics
problems : resources use and control
- Vertical territories = *subsurface is the extension of the surface* : analysis of a physical, ideal and political perspective.





CONCEPTUAL FRAMEWORK

Territorialization of geothermal energy

- Credibility: economic and technical aspect
- Governance: stakeholders
- Legitimacy: fitting a project into a context





METHODOLOGY

Semi-directive interviews

→ interview stakeholders (34 interviews: industrial, administrative, residents' associations, etc.) on territorialization dimensions

→ Covid period: video conference, same quality as *in situ* interviews

→ CAQDAS Analysis with QualCoder (coding process and category system)

Public enquiry for the Pau project

Grey literature

Understanding the support and controversies surrounding geothermal energy

- Technical reports (expert reports on earthquakes, etc.)
- Administrative documents (public enquiries, local climate plans)
- Arguments for or against geothermal energy produced by the various stakeholders

MAIN RESULTS



French lithium production from geothermal energy

1. Social acceptability is only part of the problem

While there have been controversies, projects have been stopped for technical or safety reasons.

2. The technical-economic model is not stable outside Paris Basin

Exploration and exploitation are expensive and uncertain.

Electricity is not competitive, heat production is limited to local use, lithium production is R&D.


MAIN RESULTS

3. The subsurface is poorly managed by the State.

Strasbourg Earthquakes: Préfecture for not having sufficiently monitored the data transmitted by the operator, and therefore for not playing its role as mining police.

4. Vertical territories are being built up, but incompletely

The earthquakes in Alsace were an opportunity for the public to become more aware of the subsurface, through media debates on their use, and where associations sought to understand the mechanisms of earthquakes → PUNCTUAL EXPERIMENT
